



## The Missing Word!

### Part 1: A *HUGE* Mistranslation through omission:

What's missing is the one key 2-letter word in Hebrew scriptures that unlocks many Biblical mysteries, wherever it is placed. This word is made up of two Hebrew letters, "Aleph" and "Tav," and is transliterated as "eth." The Aleph is the first letter of the Hebrew 22-letter alphabet, while the Tav is the last letter. "Eth" is found in the entire Word about 10,000 times.<sup>1</sup> Yet this word is mysteriously missing in nearly all English Bible translations!!! There are several reasons for this glaring error, which we'll understand better as we go along.

"Eth" should stay in Hebrew as אֵת (or at least as "Aleph-Tav"), in English texts (rather than be translated or even transliterated), in order to not distort this unique "key," with its full Hebraic multiple meanings. We explain the Hebrew word below, (remembering that Hebrew is written right to left, the opposite direction of English).



These (& all), Hebrew letters today, originated from ancient Hebrew pictographs<sup>2</sup> in which the Hebrew alphabet was first written. This means that each letter was designed to represent an object. In the ancient pictographic Hebrew, the Aleph is the head of an ox, so it symbolizes "strength, stability," (often seen as "the crown of leadership"). Its number value is One,<sup>3</sup> & being the first letter, it also stands for "first/one/unity."

1. We find it 9500 times in the Hebrew scriptures of the "Tanakh" ("Old" Covenant), plus 518 times in the Renewed/New Covenant of the Hebrew translations from the Greek Textus Receptus, plus in the Apocrypha. The source of this info is from the Preface of the Aleph Tav Cephher Translation (2018), page 18. For every chapter that does not have any Aleph-Tavs, there are 6 that do. And there is at least one chapter with more than 100 eths! One verse even has 11 eths! Which one? See video of footnote 7.

2. Over the hundreds of years since Moses, the symbols varied a bit in form, but then during the Babylonian captivity the alphabetic symbols were standardized into the "modern" (very-different-looking), block letters with which we are most familiar, as shown in two of them above.

3. There is no separate number system in Hebrew (or Greek). Each letter also has a number value.

Tav was first written in pictograph as an “ex or cross,” seen as two lines crossing, coming together. It stood for “covenant,” “mark,” “sign/signature,” and “perfection.”<sup>4</sup> Tav is also the last letter of the Hebrew alphabet. Each letter speaks of Yahovah, (the God of Abraham, Isaac, & Jacob). Yahovah is One God, as represented by Aleph.

*“28...Which commandment is first of all?*

*29. Jesus [Yahshua] answered:*

*“The first is, ‘Hear, O Israel, Jehovah our GOD IS ONE Jehovah.*

*30. and you must love Jehovah your God with your whole heart  
and with your whole soul and with your whole mind  
and with your whole strength.”*

**Mark 12:28-30 New World Translation**

The Messiah is quoting here from the Torah, **Deuteronomy 6:4 (& Isaiah 45:5)**. That Yahovah is One is different from all pagan religions which have pantheons of gods, with a trinity as the minimum. This passage of the Torah is so famous, it is called “The Shema,” which means “Hear...!” It is prayed daily by Messianics & their children globally, and typically has been for many centuries. It is the heart of the Renewed/New Covenant, the perfection of who Yah (God) is as shown written on the hearts & in minds of His elect sons.

Together as “eth,” the Aleph-Tav broadly speaks of “Strength of the Covenant (a phrase for Yahovah), the Signature of God (Yah)-and the bookends of the Word.” This specific portrayal is found in **Psalms 119**, whose first stanza begins with Aleph, & whose last stanza starts with Tav, collectively describing the character & nature of Yahovah as displayed in the Torah...also seen in the firstborn Son, Yahshua (Jesus), the exact likeness of Yahovah. And to be seen in the resurrection of the Renewed Covenant sons, who have the Word (Torah), written in their minds & on their hearts. So here we have the rest of the picture:



4. Great sources about “eth” include “The Cephher,” “The Messianic Aleph Tav Interlinear Scriptures,” “The Ancient Hebrew Language and Alphabet by Jeff Benner,” and “Hebrew Word Pictures by Frank Seekins.” But the reliable source that verified a few mistranslations (which we’ll point out), was “The Hebraic Tongue Restored by Fabre d’Olivet,” pages 98, 287, 301, & 465, (which we’ll disclose). I give credit to Rav Sha’ul for pointing to d’Olivet (in Sha’ul’s book 14, “Revelation”, page 52), and for expanding more about the mistranslations.

## Part 2: The Bigger Picture:

“Eth” can mean other things besides “united-perfection,” (which is seen as “perfection in the One, our God, Yahovah). We look also at Strong’s Concordance “Aleph-Tav” as Hebrew Word No. 853. Here it is defined as typically pointing to the direct object that typically follows it. Strong’s also let’s us know that it is likely a contraction of No. 226;<sup>9</sup> which has the following meanings:

- a signal, sign
- as a flag
- beacon
- monument
- mark

So in the big picture, when His Spirit inserted the Aleph-Tav in scriptures, ***eth was placed to highlight something vital, bringing it to our awareness.*** We are not to focus solely on the direct object however, but more importantly we are to view the *SUBJECT MATTER* of the passage, of which the direct object plays a role. The Aleph-Tavs are to indicate the *SUBJECT MATTER’S* merit (as Jewish Rabbis/scribes have taught for 1,000s of years).

Later on we’ll share some examples. We even discover that the Aleph-Tav placement brings emphasis whether the subject matter is good or bad. After all, there is a down-side with Yahovah & the Renewed/New Covenant, depending upon whether one is wheat or a tare.

At any rate, it is saying “**PAY ATTENTION!**” Then, for further insight, ***only His Spirit within us can provide the insight to understand the “why.”*** That is a main reason the translators omitted the “eth,” not really finding a way to translate it as one word that would seem to fit such a wide variety of context.<sup>10</sup> Yahovah is Spirit & the scriptures are a spiritual book; therefore the eth can only be fully understood by His Spirit. Both Peter & Paul for example missed the point until they received Yah’s 7-fold Spirit within.

The only English Bibles that I’m aware of (as of 2022), that include the Aleph-Tavs are:

- “The Cephher” by Stephen Pidgeon, (a top favorite for accuracy, completeness, order of books & readability)
- “The Messianic Aleph-Tav Interlinear Scriptures” (MATIS), by William Sanford.<sup>11</sup>

9. No. 226 is “Aleph-Vav-Tav.” The pictograph for the Hebrew letter Vav is a nail or tent peg. In Hebrew language it is used as a connector, commonly as “and,” “but,” and “also.” Here it is connecting the first & last letters, signifying all in between. It is transliterated as “owth.”

10. Translators have on occasion translated “eth” as a word that improves the flow of the sentence in which it is found. The Aleph-Tav is also seen with different vowel pointings, not all of which may be the eths that we are talking about. They may be distinct from each other, but I’ve not (yet) researched this.

11. The MATIS has the Aleph-Tav in red letters. It is also an unusual Interlinear Hebrew-English because it has the Hebrew written in the same direction as English, making it so easy to see how the Hebrew word was translated. And it has both the pictographic and the standard Biblical Hebrew text with Strong’s numbers (but sadly without vowel points). The transliteration is done, along with the 1987 King James translation, adjusted for accuracy to best match the Hebrew. The KJV in its fullness is in the footnote of every page for that page. William Sanford also has about 2-dozen informative you-tube “snapshot” teaching videos (about 5-minutes each). See “The Spiritual Significance of the Aleph-Tav” for the verse with the most Aleph-Tavs.

### Part 3: The Aleph-Tav as the Messiah?...maybe not?

The Greek translated the Aleph-Tav as the first & last letters of the Greek alphabet, “alpha & omega”. <sup>5</sup> This seems to point to the Messiah as the eth; but three of the verses are mistranslations! We unveil them in Parts 4 & 5, but first here are all of the verses as often written:

*“8. I am the Alpha and the Omega, “the Beginning and the End,” says the LORD  
“who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.”*

5. We see here a red flag since we now know that Revelation was first written in Hebrew, not Greek. Verification is found in the research updates by Miles Jones at his website, “[www.thewritingofGod.com](http://www.thewritingofGod.com).” Or see the summary of his 4-11-21 research update on our site, “[www.bibleconcepts.com](http://www.bibleconcepts.com)” under “Favorite Readings.” Many Bible Scholars today agree that Revelation was first written in Hebrew.

6. Seemingly a reference to [Isaiah 44:6 & 48:12](#). This verse does not have eth, but is included in the list because v. 11 equates “the First & the Last” with eth. We note also that the last verses shown in the list above equate eth with “the Beginning and the End,” as does the first verse in the list above; so I underlined all 3-phrases.

## Part 4: Two of the Three Mistranslated Verses

Now here are the same verses for ease of reference, with strike-throughs indicating what was added by later translations in two of the 3-mistranslations. The 3rd-mistranslation will come in Part 5. I've not underlined the 3-phrases to not distract from strike-throughs.

*"8. I am the Alpha and the Omega, ~~"the Beginning and the End,"~~ says the LORD  
"who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."*

Many translations correctly omit these "add-ons." <sup>8</sup> The Amplified Bible has these in italics, then in the beginning of the Bible explains that words were put in italics because they are "***not adequately supported by the original manuscripts.***" These types of additions were sometimes done by scribes based upon their own assumptions from other verses. Their assumptions were usually done to improve the reading flow in the new language, but often were an "overstep," either misleading, or an outright error.

## Part 5: The Third Mistranslation

Let's repeat the entire list, with corrections made by omitting the added phrases, (since those add-ons were not based on the oldest manuscripts). The strike-throughs indicate the third mistranslation. The third mistranslation is also an addition made under the church system.

*"8. I am the Alpha and the Omega, says the LORD*

*"who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."*

12. Seemingly referenced from Isaiah 44:6 & 48:12,

13. Seemingly an echo of Isaiah 43:1. It is noteworthy in the Jerusalem Bible, that although they do include the addition of "the Alpha and the Omega, they have "the First and the Last" in italics. Their forward material under "Typographical Notes" explains that italics were added to indicate that the phrase is basically added because it is assumed based on other scriptures. But with our mistranslation errors corrected, that connection is no longer there! Translators often do this, but sometimes it is a well-meaning over-step, tradition that actually makes the Word less effective. Revelation 22:18-19 **STERNLY WARNS TO NOT ADD-TO OR TAKE AWAY FROM THE WORD**. This warning stems from Deuteronomy 4:2 & 12:32.

Now we repeat the list once more, with all 3 of the mistranslations of additions removed. We do also underline “the Alpha & Omega,” “the First and the Last,” and “the Beginning & the End” again to emphasize these 3-phrases. Now, with correct translations constructed, we are positioned to move on to accurately identify *who* each phrase represents, as confirmed from several scriptures plus context. This is what we do in Part 6.

And in Part 6 we'll repeat the above list once again, except we'll eliminate verse 11 in **Revelation 1**, since being correctly translated it does not contain any of the 3-key phrases. We'll also use the Hebrew “Aleph and Tav” instead of the Greek “Alpha and Omega.”

15. This footnote is a repeat (for emphasis), of footnote 13. Seemingly a reference of Isaiah 43:1. Brackets are mine. It is noteworthy that in the Jerusalem Bible, although they do include the addition of “the Alpha and the Omega, they have “the First and the Last” in italics. Their forward material under “Typographical Notes” explains that italics were added to indicate that the phrase is basically added because of being assumed based on other scriptures. But with our mistranslation errors corrected, that connection is no longer there. Revelation 22:18-19 sternly warns to not add-to or take away from the Word. This warning is also seen in Deuteronomy 4:2 & 12:32.

## Part 6: Who's Who

We repeat the list yet again for quick inclusive reference. We have included a word in brackets. We now distinguish *WHO* each phrase represents, starting with “the Aleph and the Tav.” This is an easy & sure identifier in the first line, since the Hebrew Word for “LORD” is “Yahovah,” the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, our Creator, “the Father.” This means that the “Aleph and Tav” is Yahovah, and not Yahshua, the Firstborn Son of the Father. Yet the context is of “the Messiah, Yahshua,” speaking. This contradiction is a bit confusing. We’ll circle back to that thought later. Meanwhile, we must always remember that Yahshua is not Yahovah, otherwise we would contradict many scriptures, (of which the 2-main verses are referenced below in footnote 16).

Translations that were both aware & bold enough to break tradition & try to transliterate God’s name from Hebrew to English include, “The Cephher,” “The Scriptures,” “The New World Translation,” “the Hebrew Roots Bible,” & likely a few others. (I did not do an extensive search.)

17. Seemingly a reference of Isaiah 43:1. Brackets are mine. It is noteworthy that in the Jerusalem Bible, they have “the First and the Last” in italics. Their forward material under “Typographical Notes” explains that italics were added to indicate that the phrase is basically added because of being assumed, based on other scriptures, (commonly done by translators). But with our mistranslation errors corrected, that connection is no longer there, SO WE ELIMINATE IT ON THE NEXT PAGE. Translators often meant well, but sometimes it is an over-step. A false pen of the scribe, (Jeremiah 8:8), a tradition that makes the Word less effective. Revelation 22:18-19 and Deuteronomy 4:2 & 12:32 sternly warn to **NOT** add-to or take away from the Word.



In Summary, we see that “the Aleph and the Tav” is YAHOVAH. This fits with Him being “perfection in unity,” He is One God, and He is perfection.

Now let’s go to “the First and the Last” in **Revelation 1:17**. The very next verse identifies “the First and the Last” as YAHSHUA. How so is he “the First and the Last”? Well, we know that Yahshua (the Son), is the FIRST fruit of Adam (Son of Man/Son of David), to be resurrected as immortal, & he is the LAST Adam, (**1Corinthians 15:45**).

Then **Revelation 21:6** equates “the Aleph and the Tav” with “the Beginning and the End.” We know from above and the previous page that “the Aleph and the Tav” is Yahovah, the Father. This means that He is also “the Beginning and the End.” And yes, He is the cause (beginning), of all Creation, and He is the Conclusion of all things, (Creation at its full restoration). We have confirmation that “the Beginning & the End” is Yahovah from verse 7 that immediately follows.

Yahovah is one, (Deuteronomy 6:4-5), and Yahshua is under Him, (1Corinthians 11:3). being the perfect representation (image & likeness), as the “Firstborn Son of the Father.” When we see the Son, we see what the Father is like. Translations that were both aware & bold enough to try to transliterate God’s name from Hebrew to English include, “The Cepher,” “The Scriptures,” “The New World Translation,” “the Hebrew Roots Bible,” & likely a few others. (I did not search all of our library & Internet.)

Our conclusion in a nutshell is that:

- “the Aleph and the Tav” (Alpha & Omega) is YAHOVAH, (our Creator, Father)
- “the First and the Last” is YAHSHUA (the Son of Man who became the Son of God)
- “the Beginning and the End” is YAHOVAH, (our Creator, Father)

We still have however, the last phrase yet to discuss. It is repeated below in context, (with “the Beginning and the End” underlined). We then repeat the section, but with my added emphasis & inserted comments to add clarity.

- “10. And he said to me, “Do not seal the words of the prophecy of this book,  
for the time is at hand.”
11. “He who is unjust, let him be unjust still: he who is filthy, let him be filthy still:  
he who is holy, let him be holy still.”
12. “And behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to give to every one  
according to his work.”
13. “I am the Beginning and the End,”
14. “Blessed are those that do His commandments,  
that they may have the right to the tree of life,  
and may enter through the gates into the city.””

19. This is clear in “The Cephher” translation, “The English-Aramaic New Testament” & in “The Epistle of James (Ya’akov)” by Dr. Miles R. Jones. The Miles translation is from the recently discovered Hebrew manuscripts that have been proven to be a copy of the same as those used by the Apostles in the 1st Century, an incredible find indeed! It is therefore the most accurate of all.

20. YAHOVAH’s 7-fold Spirit will be sent into multitudes globally, just as it was into Yahshua, His Son. His reward is resurrection life, of which He, YAHOVAH, is the source, not Yahshua, our first example.

Yes, what we uncovered is all a shocker to the religious training of the worldly-run church system. But the true truth-seekers are not inconvenienced by the truth enough to stay in the old rut. We even hunger for more! Falsehoods are being revealed as tares & wheat come into full fruit, as seen in health, medicine, education, politics, media, sports, entertainment, etc, as well as religion. We are seeing light shine to expose corruption as new truth emerges everywhere! In Yahovah's Millennial Age, all of the systems, institutions, & ways of running this world will be vastly different, as we're beginning to see. What a glorious day we live in!

This all implies the need for change, especially in our mind-set. For example, people like William Sanford, who wrote the Messianic Aleph-Tav Interlinear Scriptures did a masterful work, but missed the mistranslations when his work was published. This means that his mistaken perspective was that the Aleph-Tav represents Yahshua, not Yahovah. He's not the only one who did this. Many teachers (including me), taught that the Aleph and the Tav stood for Yahshua. It is humbling indeed to admit that we were wrong, but we must before we can move on.

## Part 7: Examples

We've run out of space to give many examples of the Aleph-Tav. We keep in mind that *eth*" always means "Pay Attention to the subject matter here!" Sometimes it specifically means Yahovah, to emphasize Him as central to the subject matter, as seen in:

*"4. And [King Aca/Asa] commanded Yahuda [Judah]  
to seek תא YAHUAH ELOHAI <sup>21</sup> of their fathers,  
and to do the Torah and the commandment."*

**2Chronicles 14:4 The Aleph-Tav Cephher Translation**

*"31. Behold, the days come, says YAHUAH, that I will cut a Renewed Covenant with  
תא the house of Yasharel [Israel]  
and תא the house of Yahudah [Judah]..."*

*[These תא flags distinguish the two houses as unique from each other.  
while the subject matter of this verse is a vital prophetic summary of His plans for each.  
Both Aleph-Tavs are also the signature of Yahovah, the "Strength of the Covenant,"]*

**Jeremiah 31:31 The Aleph-Tav Cephher Translation**

21. Although I disagree with Stephen Pidgeon's naming of YAHOVAH as YAHUAH, it is much closer in the Hebrew Roots Bible, (as YAH'AVAH), which was published later, and of which seems to be his work. All of us truth-seekers have much to offer & will eventually come into further truth as we walk in His Spirit.

I give credit to Michael Rood who had sent out many thousands of videos, books, DVDs & other teachings using "Yahweh" as the name of God. Then he discovered from the earlier Hebrew scripture manuscripts that His name really is "Yahovah"! He then admittedly publicly that he was wrong, then moved forward using "Yahovah," (which he prefers to transliterate as "Yehovah," as do many others; and that is a valid transliteration, since the first vowel is a rushed sound, nearly silent. It can also be transliterated at "Y'hovah." Why? Because it is the Hebrew sound of the word that we put into English letters, for which there are choices that sound very similar. His Chronological Gospels uses "Yehovah."

## Part 8: More Examples

- “8. Moses said this about the tribe of Levi:  
O LORD [Yahovah], you have given the sacred lots  
to your faithful servants the Levites”  
You put them to the test at Massah [which means “testing, trial”]  
and contended with them at the waters of Meribah [means “strife”]  
[Massah & Meribah are both the same place of murmuring for water]*
- 9. The Levites obeyed your word and guarded your covenant.  
They were more loyal to you than to their אב parents, relatives, and בנים children.*
- 10. Now let them teach your regulations to Jacob  
Let them give your instructions to Israel.  
They will present incense before you  
and offer whole burnt offerings on the altar.*
- 11. Bless the Levites, O LORD [Yahovah], and accept all their work.  
Crush the loins of their enemies;  
strike down their foes so they never rise again.”*
- Deuteronomy 33:8 New Living Translation***

Of the blessings spoken to all the tribes by Moses, only Levi has אב s. They emphasize that Levi was tested, and proven to love Yahovah more than even his parents & children! The Levites were then given the privilege of teaching the Torah instructions of life to Israel, plus of being the judicial system, plus intercession. (Also see 2 **Chronicles** 35:3 for these 3-responsibilities). Israel was to become the standard for the nations, so that they too could come into the Kingdom.

In other words, the Levitical priesthood was raised to a higher level, the Melchizedek Priesthood. In the Melchizedek Priesthood we see the two governing roles of Priest and King merge into one; which was restored in Yahshua, head & body (us who are found in him). The priesthood responsibilities come to us when we become priests under our High Priest, Yahshua. And our dominion over the nations & all of Creation is also given to us when we become Kings under the King of Kings, Yahshua.

The New One-World Government is the Kingdom of the Son! <sup>22</sup> The Priests also were the authorities in matters of education, health, finances, agriculture, “religion,” military, and so forth.

22. What will this “Millennial Kingdom” that never ends look like? Isaiah 33:22 tells us that it has three branches, Executive (Kingly role), Judicial (Priestly role), & Lawgiver (Priestly Role to both teach & rule on the nations on the Torah/Word written in our minds & hearts). Note also that the Dead Sea Scrolls goes into great detail regarding how the Priests led the military.

This Kingdom of God is a resurrected first-fruit company of sons (& daughters) on earth (the focus of both “The Lord’s Prayer,” and the New Jerusalem people), to restore Creation. These people are the living stones of the third & final Temple, with the presence of Yahovah dwelling within them! There is no need for a physical Temple of stone to ever be rebuilt. Just as the first 2-Temples were higher forms of the Tabernacle of the Wilderness, so is the third Temple a higher, more spiritual form of those 2-Temples.

## Part 9: Conclusion

We see in **Daniel 9;15 & v. 16 & v19** that the eths flag that the vision is important & for the time of the end.

We then jump to the Renewed Covenant and find in **Revelation 2, 3 & 4** that each of the 7 assemblies of believers have eths associated with the remnant “Overcomers.” This mark that with these are the “Strength of the Covenant” found since they are also noted as those that “guard the works (Word/Torah) till the end.” These “Overcomers” are the ones who inherit the first resurrection to rule as kings & priests as directed by Yahshua (the High Priest & King of Kings), within their hearts & minds. They are the ones who are faithful not to the “letter of the Law,” but to the intent of the Law (Torah/Word), as Yahshua taught. They do this by the Spirit of Yahovah, which was given to Yahshua, our Bridegroom.

The New/Renewed Covenant is peppered with eths to lend deeper meaning to the text. In summary, my experience in hearing His Spirit within is that the eth can be read as:

- flagging the subject matter as something of note, (saying there is more to this!).
- think “Yahovah” (the One God, Perfection in the Oneness of Yahovah.”
- think “the Strength of the Covenant”
- think “Covenant”, “by the Covenant,” “according to the Covenant,” “Mark,” etc.
- think “a Sign,” “a Prophetic Sign,” “a Sign of consequence of the Covenant,” etc  
think a sign of relationship to the Covenant/Yahovah, (for better or worse)
- think “**PAY ATTENTION!**” (this subject matter is important to Yahovah)  
think, “flagged to alert me that there is more to this elsewhere in the Word”  
think, “there are hidden treasures of spiritual truth to be found in this”  
there are many eths associated with the Promised Land, (our Messiah)  
(& we see that dividing the land is establishing the inheritance)
- ***in all pondering, most of all we ask His 7-fold Spirit within us to reveal what it means!***

And may you all enjoy this amazing tool of eth of seeing the Word with new eyes!
