GETTING TO KNOW ALL ABOUT YOU... The crystalline voice of Julie Andrews charmed us for years with the words of this lively song. I had forgotten all about it long ago, but one recent morning I awoke with the words and melody ringing joyfully in my heart. Actually, it has stayed with me ever since. It was a word from the Father and oh yes we are getting to know the One who is our new life! And we are seeking to know all about Him and His ways. He is revealing His heart and His love to us, and though our "...outward man perish, yet our inward man is renewed day by day." (II Cor.4:16), and we are as it were, lifted up and swept into His embrace to new heights and new glories. There are many opinions about the Bible and its value for Christians, but for me, the Bible is the greatest love story ever told. It is the very mysterious, romantic and yes, passionate story of man looking for his maid. "There are three things which are too wonderful for me, yea, four which I know not: The way of an eagle in the air; the way of a serpent upon a rock; the way of a ship in the midst of the sea; and the way of a man with a maid." (Prov.30:18-19)

Hidden in the events, the characters and even the prophecies written in the Bible, is the story of Christ redeeming His bride, and gathering her unto Himself; it is the story of the Father's love for His creation. And as His bride, we are getting to know Him and learning to know all about Him, for when we will know Him as He is, we will be like Him, in perfect union with Him, in spirit, soul and body. Until then, we set our hearts and minds to continue walking by the light of His Holy Spirit, and to learn to know Him as He is, and not as we imagined Him to be. An old poem says, "To err is human, to forgive is divine." It is human to err, and we are humans; we are born in total darkness, unaware of the realm of life that surrounds us and moves us from within, but as He renews our minds and hearts, we enter into the realm of the divine, and are born anew. As small children growing up, our world is limited to our house, our neighborhood and perhaps our town. We have no idea whatsoever of the greatness of the world that surrounds us. And we are born totally unaware of the very real, invisible places of spirit, in us and around us. The Internet and the ease of world travel today have opened much of the world to young and old minds, but we are still in darkness when it comes to the realities that exist in the world of "spirit." Most humans only have a vague imagination of what eternal life really means; they would rather wait to find out after they die.

It is obvious that today, many humans are led to seek their roots, and to find their true identity. They might have been taught that their ancestors were once apes or even amoebae, but that does not answer the yearning, the restlessness that they feel in their souls to know themselves better. Humankind is on a quest to find their true purpose; they have been earthly "soul" creatures, but they know that they are more than that. Some children are troubled, feeling they are boys in girl's bodies, or vise versa. Some go through untold suffering and agony, even surgically changing the sex of their bodies, looking for a physical identity that fits them, not knowing that what they feel is the call of the spirit within. The world is in gross darkness, being totally ignorant of the world of spirit that they live in. Seminaries are staffed with teachers who are trapped into a maze of established doctrines, teaching future ministers out of the darkness of their own minds. This was very hard for me at first, and I was so grateful that the love I shared with Michael was holding strong, and I still found my shelter and resting place with him.

As the years passed, the day dawned when Michael was changing and dementia was taking its toll. For seven long years, the security of home was being shaken to the core. It was during these difficult years, that the Lord took me through a school of higher learning in the Spirit. After Michael passed away, I spent four years alone, I needed that. Then my daughter came to live with me and it took time, for two independent women to adjust to a new life together. But God was faithful and patient with us, and in a few years we were on our way to finding our home together. Yet, while we truly enjoy this home, we both know that this is not permanent either, and we are now finding our true forever home, not after our death, but now in Christ. Home is Christ's love within, it is a place of peace and joy within; it is Christ's love within our soul and spirit. This is home forever, whether in this body or not. The stability of this home is God within, it is His abode. It is the place that Jesus has been preparing for us. When Jesus faced His bewildered disciples to bid them good-bye for a season, He said, "In my Father's house are many mansions, (dwelling places), If it were not so I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you... that where I am ye may be also." (Jn.14:2,3) These mansions are "us." All the fires and testing we have been going through have been Jesus preparing us to be our Father's mansions. Our home is the kingdom of God within. "For in Him, (Christ), dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily. And ye are complete in Him which is the head of all principality and powers." (Col.2:9-10)

ENTERING THE KINGDOM OF GOD- The kingdom of God is the realm of God's Spirit within us. It is our soul and spirit in perfect harmony with the Godhead; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is home. Paul says it like this, "...the kingdom of God is righteousness, and peace and joy in the Holy Ghost." Do we do them to get more from God, to be accepted and loved more, to be more gifted, to shine among the brethren, to have a great ministry, or do we do only what the Spirit leads us to do? Are we moved by the desire to make a better name for ourselves in this world, or are we being led by truth, love and compassion for lost souls, for our brethren, for our country, for God's creation, and yes for ourselves also?

AN OLD VISION. STILL NEW- This happened many years ago, yet it is still very vivid today. I was sitting in my chair reading, when as a bolt of lightening, I received a clear vision of the glory of God that shall be. It really had nothing to do with what I was reading, and it may have been prompted by something I had heard before, but this time I saw it and felt it as it filled me with awe and joy unspeakable. A spiritual experience is never easy to communicate on paper, and I do not think I will be able to do that, but perhaps I can stir up the witness within you and you may be quickened into the same heavenly vision.

What I saw was the new creation of God in Christ. It was a people filled with His glory, on display for the whole world to see.
