




Truth Nuggets

Book Review The Chronological Gospels



We're eager to share our very favorite English translation of Scriptures, with its only downside being the limitation to six Biblical books: Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts, & Revelation. The 350-page publishing layout is superb, making the large print paperback 2nd-edition pleasant & easy-to-read.

It is the gold-standard for Gospel chronologies, the only one where all flows seamlessly, so that it reads as a gripping story. The translation used is what author Michael Rood calls, "The Hebrew Kings James Version," formerly, "The Corrected King James Version, (CKJV)."

How is this translation different? Keep in mind that the KJV was done under the authority & direction of an anti-Pilgrims/Separatists king. Today it could be compared to an “Authorized Obama Version.” But Rood (with his extensive knowledge of the Hebrew language & culture in which the scriptures were first written), is able to capture the intent along with the accuracy. Rood brings clear understanding by inserting words in italics, plus abundant in-depth explanatory footnotes, making delightful reading!

As for the books’ truth-bombs, here’s a very small sample:

1. God’s name is decisively shown from Hebrew scriptures to be “Yehovah,” (pages xxxi-xxxiii). (Note that being a transliteration, it can also be written in English as “Y’hovah,” and even “Yahovah,” since the first vowel in Hebrew is neither a short “e” or “a,” but rather a rushed, nearly-silent sound.)
2. Yeshua’s genealogy in Matthew Chapter 1 is solidly confirmed to be entirely Mary’s, (“Miriam” in Hebrew), (see pages 12-15 with great charts on pages 16-17). The last line in her genealogy should read, “Yoseph, the father of Miriam,” NOT the husband of Joseph. Both her husband & father had the same name, which happens even today. The big elephant in the room is that the genealogy of Joseph in Luke 3 is NOT the same genealogy as Matthew 1. They cannot both be of Miriam’s husband, Yoseph. Also, the Promised Seed (Messiah) was to come through the woman, not the man. The Kingly line comes through Mary’s father, the Zadok High Priestly line comes from Mary’s mother’s line, a sister to the mother of John the Baptist, making Yeshua legally King & High Priest.
3. The ministry of Yeshua/Y’shua/Yahshua was exactly 70-weeks, NOT 3 1/2 years! His ministry spanned from the day he was baptized, until the day his disciples were baptized in the Holy Spirit, (490-days, one of 3-layers of fulfillment of Daniel’s 70-week prophecy). Read about it with the proofs throughout, but especially starting on page ii of the Introduction. Additionally, he provides historical documentation of the origin and motive for the religious tradition of the 3 1/2 year ministry myth.
4. Yeshua died Wednesday afternoon and rose 72-hours later on Sabbath, although no one knew that he had already risen until Sunday morning, (page 213).
5. Rood corrects Matthew 23:3 to read as, “Do what he (Moses) says but not what they (Pharisees) say.” Dozens more truth-bombs abound. Truth-seeking is not for the faint-of-heart because new facts challenge one to trade comfortably-entrenched religious traditions for truth.
